### Confessions of a Drugstore Car Guy By Carroll G Anderson

One of the benefits of growing up a Baby Boomer was the front-row seat it provided me in the Golden Age of the American Automobile. I believe the quarter-century from 1948 to 1973 represents the apex of the American car culture and I was there for all of it! As I get older the memories I have of that period get better, probably because everything going on around me in the present is so damned confusing.

During that period, I believe, pick-up trucks went from utilitarian work vehicles to the daily driver of choice for a whole lot of Americans. I think I might have read somewhere (maybe in *Better Homes & Gardens* at the Doctors Office) that the quality of a home is defined by its "coffee table books." If that's the case it explains why our only coffee table book is a big, glossy history of pickup trucks. I love 'em and I've been driving them from the very beginning.

My first pickup recently bubbled to the surface of my memory. It was a '62 Ford F-100 "unibody" ½ ton with a six and "three-on-the-tree." Until domestic reality intervened and I was left with nothing but my memories there had been some discussion of a road trip. That brought to mind another road trip I didn't take.

Back in 1966 I was a rookie Airman (one stripe) just out of Basic Training and settling-in at my first duty station, Shephard AFB, Wichita Falls, Texas. My letters home must have been pretty pitiful because my Dad decided to bring me my truck. Believe me, nothing could be finer for a young GI away from home for the first time than having his own wheels!

Anyway, my Dad wrote that he and my brother Fred, who'd just turned 16, would bring my truck to Wichita Falls. I knew they were coming but I didn't know when. One morning I got a call from the Security Police saying my truck was at the Main Gate. Apparently my family, not wanting to bother or navigate the Byzantine channels required to find one G.I. in a sea of thousands, had simply



dropped-off the truck and headed home. I'd like to think I thanked them later but I don't remember that.

Some of the details of that trip came to light not too long ago when I uncovered a cache of my Dad's old trip logs (he always wrote down mileage, routes, etc. for his road trips). That trip was 941 miles each way and featured such exotic way points as Roswell, New Mexico and Idalou, Texas. So, what happened was my Dad and Fred left home (Goodyear, Arizona) at 2:30 one morning and arrived in Wichita Falls at 11:45 that night. Then, as far as I know, they just turned around and drove home. No mention in the log about getting a motel or stopping for a midnight snack!

As I write this it occurs to me how much things have changed. These days we'd have been in touch pretty much constantly by cell phone, IM, or text (I guess my Dad would have used the newfangled technology) and the folks manning the gate could have looked me up instantly on their computer. Well, in those days a phone call took a pocketful of nickles if you could find a pay phone and letters took several days to make the trip Dad and Fred made in just over 21 hours.

Speaking of how much things have changed; once I got my truck I was able to go out with my buddies and enjoy the north Texas back roads. One evening a couple of friends and I were standing along one of those Texas back roads, facing the ditch, making room for more beer. Along came a Texas State Trooper. Since it was obvious what we were doing and that we were from the Base he simply asked that we be careful and please pull off on a side road next time we had stop to make room. It was obvious we were from the Base because no selfrespecting Texas teenager would have had the haircuts we had nor would they have worn the street clothes we were wearing (not a pair of Wranglers or Justin boots in the bunch).

You know, that story reminds me of just how handy that truck was back in the day. I guess, from 1964 thru 1966, that old truck carried as much beer, volume-wise, as the white lightning 'ol Billie Bob Moonshiner ever hauled over Thunder Road! Hell, we didn't even have to unload it, just ice it down in the bed and back up to the party. And we could set up lawn chairs in the back at the Drags or Drivein movies.

Back to pickup trucks. Sometime after I owned my '62 Ford, pickups made the transition from work truck to daily driver. In the Seventies and Eighties, as the economy languished and car sales declined, truck sales began to increase. Insurance companies and the Government were getting fussy about safety and, all-of-a-sudden, it was cheaper to buy a truck. For quite a few years the best selling cars were pickup trucks. According to Spiderman, "*With great power, comes great responsibility.*" Unfortunately not all pick-up truck drivers know, or believe, that. You know who I'm talking about; in the 1950 Disney cartoon, Goofy, as mild-mannered average guy Mr. Walker becomes road hog Mr. Wheeler when he gets behind the wheel. Too many pickup truck drivers become what my brother Cyrus used to call "Pickup Nazis." I was remined of them the other day as I watched some guy, jake-brake at full volume, blow through an intersection in his raised, monster-tired, chrome-stacked, diesel-powered Ram <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ton.

To be fair, a big truck does tempt you to exploit your size and weight advantage in traffic. The first time Elayne drove our new '72 Ford F-100, 4-wheel drive pickup she remarked how great it was that other drivers didn't push her around the way they did in our VW. That advantage, however, doesn't excuse blocking out the sun when riding a slower driver's bumper.

Last night another pickup truck memory bubbled-up as I watched a movie starring, as far as I'm concerned, a sixty -something Dodge pickup. It reminded of the two trucks I bought sight-unseen so I'd have a home for a newly rebuilt Mopar "semi-hemi" 318 I had hanging around. Those truck are so clunky and ugly you just can't help loving them!

My friend Bob Peters bought them for me and stored them (in Arizona) until I could check them out and decide which one or how much of each one I wanted to keep. They were a pair of '64's; long wheel-base, wide beds and, between the two, would have made a great truck. By the time I finally got to Phoenix to check them out I was no longer in the market and Pete kept them until he got rid of his entire collection a year or two later.
